**LONG ISLAND'S HUNTINGTON HOSPITAL PURCHASES PHARMACY IV
AUTOMATION TECHNOLOGY TO ENHANCE PATIENT SAFETY, EFFICIENCY**

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla., November 4, 2003—ForHealth Technologies Inc., a leading pharmaceutical automation provider, announced today that Huntington Hospital in Long Island, NY will install and use ForHealth's IV pharmacy robotic technology to place additional emphasis on patient safety and efficiency.

ForHealth Technologies is the leader in fully automated devices for IV preparation. IntelliFill i.v. (formerly PARxD IV) automates the compounding and labeling of up to 300 IV syringes per hour in reservoir mode or up to 60 syringes per hour for an IV batch, both of which function with a high level of volumetric accuracy. By employing bar code scanning, vision systems and weight confirmation steps, IntelliFill i.v. reduces medication errors and promotes long-term hospital cost savings.

Huntington Hospital is a 398-bed community, not-for-profit institution located in western Suffolk County on Long Island's north shore. Since 1994 the hospital has been a sponsored member of the North Shore LIJ Health System.

"Huntington is committed to patient safety at every level, from boardroom to bedside," said Michael B Grosso, MD, vice president for medical affairs and quality, and director of patient safety. "Our CEO and I meet regularly with staff to dialogue about safety and to be sure they

understand that our first obligation is to 'do no harm.' Our board of trustees takes very seriously its obligation to ensure that our patients receive care that is consistently safe and excellent.”

“We feel that the IntelliFill i.v. system makes sense for our medication safety program,” adds Jack Mateyunas, pharmacy chief at Huntington. “This technology automates an otherwise error-prone, repetitive task and permits us to deploy valuable pharmacy staff in new ways. We anticipate that this will further enhance our ability to provide timely, accurate pharmacy services to our growing hospital.”
