**FORHEALTH TECHNOLOGIES CELEBRATES PHARMACY IV AUTOMATION
MILESTONE: TWO MILLION SYRINGES FILLED IN U.S. HOSPITALS**

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla., February 23, 2004—ForHealth Technologies Inc., a leader in automated devices for IV preparation, reached another major milestone today with its pioneering pharmacy robotic technology system, IntelliFill i.v. Since its introduction in October 2002, the system has filled two million small-volume injectable doses in syringes in top hospitals across the country.

“As a medical center, we have experienced a tremendous cost-savings and a significant reduction in manual labor since installing the IntelliFill i.v. system last year,” said John Tourville, director of pharmacy for Children’s Medical Center of Dallas, Texas. “The automated syringe flushes alone have saved the Center about \$400 per day, while eliminating tedious manual labor functions. The system has had such a positive impact on productivity that our staff would not want to manage without it.”

To achieve these results, IntelliFill i.v. (formerly PARxD IV) automates the compounding and labeling of IV syringes which are filled with a +/- five percent volumetric accuracy. By employing bar code scanning, vision systems and weight confirmation steps, IntelliFill i.v. reduces medication errors and promotes long-term hospital cost savings.

“IntelliFill i.v. is really proving itself in the area of productivity and quality,” said Dennis Tribble, Pharm. D., chief technology officer at ForHealth Technologies. “We have customers that routinely prepare over 2,000 syringes daily and some have produced as many as 5,000 syringes in one day. Each syringe is backed by more information, more documentation, and more quality control than anything produced by hand.”
